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BNBuilders and Miller | Hull Architects Selected for KCLS Design-Build Project

Contractor/Architect Team to Undertake Five New Libraries

On March 7, the King County Library System (KCLS) awarded BNBuilders and Miller | Hull Architects the contract to design and build the five (5) libraries including: Black Diamond, Snoqualmie, Carnation, Fall City and Muckleshoot.

The five 5,000-6,000-square-foot libraries will share the same internal library components, known as *elements of continuity* such as books, computers, etc. All are located within rapidly growing and evolving areas. These are historically rural communities that are experiencing recent growth and suburbanization.

The new libraries will be an important civic addition for each community, but each of the library sites is unique. As a result, BNBuilders and Miller | Hull Architects will be responsible for working with the local communities to understand their visions for the future, known as *elements of distinction* such as exterior features, art work, etc.

In August 2005, KCLS' Board of Trustees approved the use of a Design Build process as it enables faster design and construction of the five new facilities at a reduced cost without impacting the design integrity.
